The academic year 2009-2010 has indeed been a challenging year, both in terms of constant disruption in the academic schedule caused by the current political turmoil gripping the State, and also the depleting opportunities caused by recession. In spite of many hurdles that came in the way of smooth academic functioning, thanks to the commendable work ethics at St. Joseph's, our high degree of commitment to achieve sustained quality in promoting human excellence and competitive spirit among students, resulted in an eventful year. It is indeed a moment of great pride and honour to present before

you the 13th College Annual Report reviewing the academic year 2009-2010. The report outlines a multitudinal range of extension activities, departmental events, students' achievements both in the academic and non-academic categories. Our prime passion is to identify a holistic educational programme that empowers our students to confidently face the economic challenges and social dynamics of the contemporary world.

2008-09 marked a stupendous milestone in the history of St. Joseph's College, as our college was accredited by NAAC with 'A' grade with CGPA of 3.51, which was indeed an incredible achievement for a young college. Close on heels, came another feather in the cap-The prestigious CSR-GHRDC B School survey of November 2009 placed our MBA program on the 9th rank among top B schools in A.P and accorded us the 32nd national rank among the promising B schools in India. No doubt that we have made a mark for ourselves in the premiere league of academic institutions, but our march for excellence continues as we move towards Autonomy.

A brief glimpse into the history of the college:

Archdiocese of Hyderabad established St. Joseph's college on 10th July 1997. His Grace Late Most Rev. S. Arulappa, the then Archbishop of Hyderabad blessed the building and Prof. Rama Kistaiah the then Vice-chancellor of Osmania University inaugurated the College. Rev. Fr. Dr. V.K. Swamy was appointed as the founder Principal and Secretary of the college. Most Rev. Marampudi Joji took over the Archdiocese of Hyderabad in April, 2000 as the Archbishop of Hyderabad. Since then under his dynamic leadership the institution has been marching forward to its present glory. In the same year permission was granted to start P.G. courses like MCA, MBA and M.Sc Maths.

From a modest start with 130 students the college has grown in strength and stature to more than 1550 students both undergraduate and post graduate courses. With a great sense of pride I state that the college has emerged as one of the finest educational institutions in the twin cities of Hyderabad and

Secunderabad, accredited by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) with 'A' Grade. We have properly ventilated class rooms, seminar halls, Labs and libraries to serve both UG and PG programs. The management has provided 20 LCD projectors for effective teaching learning process. The students are also trained to use ICT for their seminars and projects. It's a great honour for the institution on completing 13 years in imparting value based education and inculcating balanced discipline among the students. The college has made an impact on all stakeholders-parents, students, industrialists, corporate heads and academicians which is reflected from its demand for admissions. It is our pleasure to share our joy and happiness on this college day celebration with friends and associates who have been the guiding and motivating force in all our endeavours. As the founder Principal and Secretary of the College it is my duty and privilege to acknowledge our Chairman and Archbishop Joji's continuous patronage. But for our educational Society- HAES support, this organization would not have grown to this extent. Enthused by St. Joseph, the patron saint - who was an exemplary of diligence and honesty, for both the teacher and the taught and the motto of the college viz '**Knowledge, Love and Service**', we instil in our members (staff & students) the **core values** that we cherish. The students are awarded with a cash prize of Rs.500 for 100% attendance during the College day celebrations. Academic Excellence

We at St. Joseph's take great pride in the regularity with which our classes are conducted. The students too appreciate the meticulously prepared and religiously followed schedule of classes. A continuous evaluation of their academic performances is done and results are communicated to their parents. A regular feedback on teachers' performance is gathered and the required modifications in teaching methods are introduced. The above practices help both the students and the staff in their pursuit of

excellence.

It encourages the achievers, especially those who secure 100 marks in any subject in the University Exams by awarding scholarships and other benefits. The management announced during last academic year those who secure more than 80% aggregate in optional subjects at University examinations they would be awarded Rs.1000. Accordingly 110 graduate students found their places for academic excellence award. The College management challenges many more students to join this club of academic excellence.

Orientation programmes

Orientation program for staff as well as for fresh batch of students joining our College marks the beginning of an academic year. This academic year the Faculty- orientation was conducted on 5th-6th June'09 at Satyodayam, Tarnaka with the help of three resource persons Rev Fr. J. Pakia Raj S.J., a Counselor & Neuro-linguistic practioner, Mrs. Meena Hariharan, HOD Health Psychology, Hyderabad Central University, and Rev Fr. K. Stanislaus, Associate Professor, Loyola Academy .

Every batch of students was lead into prayer before they were introduced to academic life in the College. They were given a general orientation in goal setting and personality development

by the Counsellors. The concerned departments offered an overview about the curriculum at hand. The Dept. of English gave an overview of various literary club activities, and the importance of communication skills.

The College conducts Bridge Courses for the benefit of non commerce students and Communicative English for Telugu medium students who hail from a rural background. It helps them participate in the teaching - learning process. Apart from the regular academic activities, we also conduct many Value Addition or Extension programs by experts drawn from industries, corporate HR and academicians.

The College arranged two days seminar for UG students on Self Esteem by Fr. Stephen Muthu SJ. It was very useful to them. Vision 2020 Empowerment program was conducted for Ist yr students on 23rd Oct. 2009 by Sriram Atri, a disciple of Swami Sukhabodhananda.

Red Cross and NSS

As part of our social responsibility, we have constituted the college chapter of the Red Cross Society and the NSS wing. 7. Literary Club Activities:

'Go Getter's Club' our in- house literary Club, managed by the Department of English has been active through the academic year, 2009-2010 conducting sessions on GDs, presentation skills etc.

A presentation skills session was conducted at the beginning of the year for students of 2nd year (B.Com/B.Sc), where group presentations were made on topics of general interest.

b. VAT:

A Verbal Ability Test was conducted for the first year students in July 2009. The aim of the test was to gauge the students' entry-level grasp over English.

c. Movie Goers Club:

A few meaningful films dealing with adolescent issues and racial prejudice were screened for the students of select classes. This was done to aid and supplement their English

curriculum and also to encourage among them the ability to think critically and analytically. Each film screening was followed up by a classroom discussion on relevant issues.

d. Book Lovers Club:

In order to inculcate reading habits among students, the Department of English runs a 'Book Lovers Club' where books for general reading are circulated among the students. Books are lent on the basis of students' interest as well as their level of reading. Several first-time readers are drawn to these books, thanks to the relentless efforts of the department.

8. Talent search contest:

The Dept. of English played host to the Talent Search Contest held by Radio Mirchi (*Aa Nach Le*) and Frito Lays & Big F M (*Hrudayalogic*) on the college campus where the dancing and singing prowess of our students came to the fore.

The college also conducts competition in documentary and short film-making, PowerPoint presentations, elocution, debate etc. The students are encouraged to participate in good numbers and are duly rewarded. The college sets aside a considerable amount of money in the budget to facilitate these awards. I am proud to say that our students have won many laurels for us in inter-collegiate events.

Alumni Association:


